By going through the "open market" of all the Entities, by receiving the reports of the Treasurer and of the General Council, by opening ourselves to the different kenoses coming from the different Entities, we were led to "feel" the reality of the Congregational-Body as a whole and in its different members. At this point, we were at the bottom of the U-shaped process proposed for this General Chapter. Before beginning to climb back up, we were invited to take the time to listen to the calls of Wisdom.

To this end, starting early Monday afternoon, each capitulant spent a long time in personal dialogue with Wisdom. The silence continued until Tuesday morning, including the evening meals and breakfast. This long period of silence enabled us to re-read our notes on the first days of this Chapter, on the evening integrations, on the morning faith sharing, while listening carefully to what Wisdom had said to us. On Tuesday morning, we were invited to walk in pairs - like the disciples of Emmaus - to share our experience of what we had heard from Wisdom. So, in the garden, it was possible to come across several duos walking along while sharing what each had heard.

Then each of these duos had to write two sentences reflecting their two experiences. Then the two duos met up with two other duos to write two sentences together, making a group of eight pairs.

It was a personal and community experience of listening to Wisdom and listening to each other in an attempt to hear what Wisdom was saying to us at this moment in the Chapter and through the history of our Congregation.



THE DISCIPLES OF EMMAUS

GUIDED TOUR



A group of 8 sisters and 2 translators came together to visit the "tunnel" that joins the gardens of the Mother House to the former St-Nicolas Abbey, now known as "Mission Langues" and currently occupied by Ukrainian refugees.

For years, this building was home to the Daughters of Wisdom who came from all over the world to learn French. So it was with a touch of nostalgia in their hearts, filled with many memories and the joy of returning to their roots, that some of the capitulants ventured to this place.

Thanks to our guide Sister Marie-Claire Puthiath (Sister of Our Lady of Charity of the Good Shepherd), our visit was a wonderful discovery of the history of this Congregation which has welcomed us since the beginning of the Chapter. While touring part of the 15-hectare estate, Sister Marie-Claire narrated the rich life of their Foundress: Saint Marie-Euphrasie Pelletier (1796 -1868).

What followed was a truly spiritual experience.

Sister Marie-Claire suggested that we walk through the 55 metre tunnel in the dark and in silence to free ourselves from our fears. As we emerged from the tunnel, our eyes were caught by the light of the sun, which - as our guide reminded us - reminds the light of the Risen Christ.

For the record, the former St-Nicolas Abbey, bought by Sister Marie-Euphrasie Pelletier in 1854, was located outside the monastic enclosure that the sisters had to observe. The construction of the tunnel between May and August 1855 was a creative and practical way of getting around the difficulty by allowing access to the Abbey while respecting the canonical rule.

At the end of our walk, we discovered the magnificent façade of the thousand-year-old Abbey and its white tufa stone walls. It is bordered by beautiful vines whose grapes were once harvested by the novices of Our Lady of Charity of the Good Shepherd.

After a photo session, it was time to return for another Chapter session, after having crossed the tunnel from darkness to light for a second time...

GOURMET BREAKS
